DIVE OHIO DAY

Dive Ohio Day, sponsored by the Ohio Council of Skin and Scuba Divers, Inc., is scheduled for August 11, in a lake or quarry near you....

2001 will be the 4th year for the event. The purpose is to enjoy the variety and quality of scuba right in your back yard -- is it the easy attractions of the nearby dive resort, the wrecks in Lake Erie, or the cold clean water in the deeper quarries, Ohio diving has a lot to offer.

To many people, Ohio diving is squeezing into a 7mm wet suit or dry suit, to float onto silty "artifacts" in cold water. Although this might have been the case on your early spring certification dives, it's not true in August. For most of us, a shorty suit will more than suffice, and visibility is currently 20-35 feet in our quarries, away from the students.

Business

Chair Mark Beatty again thanked everyone for the Council event, officers of the Council and Rich Lauer as well as the individual divers who join beyond their club membership. It appeared that the Ohio Council Scuba Expo 2001 would break even financially, which is good news. The event is not intended to make money, but it is always good news not do lose money, either. Membership agreed that the event was very successful, wonderful programs, excellent accomodations and great food.

WebMaster: the webmaster was not able to attend, but wants to remind everyone to list your club contacts and to be sure to offer web link connections between your club web page and the Ohio council site. Several e-group and other communication forums have been established which allow member representatives from each club to receive monthly updates, urgent news, and other current information.

Speakers Bureau: Chair Marty Bailey and Annette Soule have not received many forms from speakers. Recently, Dennis Hale (well known as the only survivor of the shipwreck Daniel J. Morrell) filled out a form. It is reminded that the Council will pay \$50 to a club (one per year) to help a club be able to afford to pay a speaker for coming to their meeting. It is reminded that as a courtesy, any club inviting a speaker should pay their expenses for travel, arrange their meal, and pay at least a \$25 to \$50 honorarium for their time and effort. Although many speakers will give the honorarium back to the club, or suggest the club donate it to DAN or the Scholarship fund, it should still be offered.

Scott Pansing has possession of the Ohio Council flag and other miscellaneous materials.

Addresses: It is vital that clubs update the Council when a change of officers takes place so that the correct person/address is used for mailing membership, Faceplate, and other information. After your club elections, please forward the name and address of the President and whomever you wish the Faceplate to be sent (sometimes your club newsletter editor so that information can be contained in your own next newsletter.) Also, each club should designate a representative who's name, address and perhaps email address can be listed on the web for prospective members who find the Council site, or for other Council member clubs/individuals who wish to pass information from club to club or request information about events.

Communication: the open e-group forum is ohiodiver@yahoo and through yahoo members can sign into a special group for communication and voting. Please use your official title on correspondence when voting or otherwise representing your club for input or response. Also, if you use an email "nick-name" such as diverdown@ please include your "real name" ! With help, the Council website should include information about the Council, links to the by-laws, other clubs, Diving in Ohio, Dive related businesses, Charters, the Scholarship and an application for the Scholarship.

Next Year's Banquet Ball: Bill Nightingale of Aqua Amigos stated that next year's event will take place at the Radisson (Rts. 2 & 91) on Feb 8,9,10, will feature "Dive Nostalgia" and will feature Stan Waterman as keynote speaker. Eight dive stores are sponsoring the event. Bids for future Banquets were accepted: 2003 TA/Sea Nags and Central Ohio Clubs. Bill Libecap suggested that some consistency to include place, name and date would help assure vendors participation. Discussion followed regarding whether the event should remain in the center of the state, move around or follow a pattern of north, central, south and repeat. It was suggested that the end of the weekend report including the financial report be copied and held for review by future clubs as they plan their event for the Council. This would help clubs understand what needs to be done.

It was announced that the Wright State event would be the 1st weekend of May. Dates of conventions of interest to Ohio Divers need to be given to Mark Beatty so they can be listed in the Council calendar. Also, we do not want to schedule any Ohio Diving events/conventions in conflict with other major shows. Other discussion included the intent of the state of Ohio to buoy 6 shipwrecks this summer for recreational diving. Bill 13, the Canadian bill with provisions that concerned American divers, has been put to rest, although another similar bill could develop. Legislative Action Committee will be a watchdog for this. Rex Damschroder, a state Representative and diver, is attempting to change the law regarding Oxygen as a controlled substance so that divers may obtain and provide o2 for a diving accident under the Good Samaritan law.

The New Wave Dive shop, Steve Sheridan of Scuba Recovery and supported by Bay Area Divers are attempting to receive permission from the State to place a ship on the lake bottom near the proposed diving preserve of Kelley's Island. The vessel has been identified by Steve Sheridan.

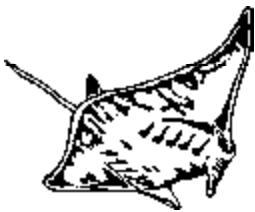

Wreck Buoy Project -- This Year Maybe?

It seems to be so close. For four years we have been trying to get buoys placed on some of the wrecks of Lake Erie. This year the Coast Guard gave us the approval to place buoys on six popular wreck sites: the *Admiral*, the *Dundee*, the *Prince*, the *Morning Star*, the *Sand Merchant*, and the *Craftsman*.

BUT (don't you hate that word?), at the last minute, the State Historical Society again stipulated that these buoys must be placed on cement blocks, and not on the wrecks themselves. So while we're not back to square 1, there's still a lot of work to be done.

Russ MacNeal, Chairman of the Governor's task force, is now busy getting bids to take the cement blocks out to the wrecks. This could be prohibitively expensive -- but we've been told money is available. Blocks themselves have been donated, and the other needed materials have been purchased.

So we're still hoping this project can be completed this year. Meanwhile, thanks to all of you who participated with the petitions last year. Also, thanks to Russ and all those (too numerous to mention here) who worked so hard on this project.

BCD Vests Are Recalled

NOTE: *This story was sent to us from several sources. We have not checked for accuracy...*

A California company is recalling about 10,000 scuba jackets designed to prevent divers from floating to the surface because the jackets could put them in danger of drowning.

An overpressure valve on the buoyancy compensator devices, or BCDs, could stick open, presenting the danger, the Consumer Product Safety Commission said Thursday. Divers should not use the jackets, which were sold by dive stores and mail-order catalogs from September 2000 through March 2001.

The jackets were sold under these brand and model names:
