SLAC Committee Disbanded

The Submerged Lands Advisory Council (SLAC) is a Governor-appointed committee that was established in 1987 to oversee the management of shipwrecks in Lake Erie. The Abandoned Shipwreck Act of 1987 turned title of the shipwrecks over to each state, and each state had to form its own legal process for the management of this resource. The SLAC committee was included in Ohio's Law, and includes subcommittees for education and legislation.

It was mentioned at the SLAC meeting early in 2003 by David Mackey of ODNR, that this committee might be disbanded, along with CRAC (Coastal Resource Advisory Council), and combined into one committee.

This possibility was met by the grave concern of the SLAC Council, and all those in attendance at this meeting, because this Council has accomplished a great deal since its inception, and has served as a voice for Ohio divers. The CRAC Council has a dissimilar agenda, focused on Lake Erie's coastal development, plus shoreline erosion and preservation.

Divers fought hard during the process of passing Ohio's original bill, to have a voice specifically focused on the management of shipwrecks. ODNR did not want another "special interest" group, so they tried then to include us in the CRAC. We won at the final hearing, and the SLAC was included in the law.

We had hoped to hear more on this possible disbandment and to have a voice in addressing our concerns; however, divers later heard after-the-fact that the disbanding had already taken place. We cannot express our disappointment enough!

The merging of the two councils has still not taken place to date, and many divers feel that there is no longer a driving force behind the tasks that faced this Council (including shipwreck buoys, support and sponsorship of underwater archaeology courses and shipwreck conservation, intentional sinkings and artificial reefs, and the Kelleys Island Underwater Preserve.)

Divers are encouraged to monitor the progress of merging the councils, and to help keep everyone up to date. We will do our best through the OCSSDI, via the *Faceplate*, the website, and special mailings, to keep you informed.

Scuba Swim for Diabetes

For years, the *Faceplate* has been announcing the annual Scuba Swim for Diabetes, held by the Diabetes Association of Greater Cleveland. This year we're happy to announce that there are two: New Wave Dive Center and Aqua Hut have added a program in Toledo.

The two programs are different dates: Toledo's is February 29; Cleveland's is April 25. In both of these, divers will do games and puzzles underwater, while raising money for the Diabetes organizations by raising pledges. In Toledo, there will also be a Discover Scuba for anyone ages 10 and above.

OCSSDI MTG – Sunday, July 27, 2003

MINUTES: Motion to accept: 1st Jack Hardy 2nd Dave Soule

OLD BUSINESS:

Website: Mark Beatty has make payments available online via PayPal (we may have received one). Dive trip postings also available online now.

Legislative Committee: O2 - Ron Smith will keep us informed on O2 bill status (awaiting Senate vote). Following discussions concerning the 1) possession hurdle; and 2) guidelines to administer, Ron Smith proposed motion to appoint a committee to address training guidelines for administering Medical Oxygen upon passage of HB64. 1st Marty Bailey 2nd Dave Soule
A committee was formed with a timeframe of March 21st (the next Council meeting) to compile agencies guidelines. The following are the committee members and agencies they have agreed to contact:

Shipwreck Buoys – OCSSDI considered using its nonprofit status in order to assist with some of the obstacles on buoying Lake Erie shipwrecks per SLAC committee meetings. SLAC and CRAC committees have been disbanded to our knowledge. No news on a new “combined” Governor Advisory Council. Per Ron Smith, strict laws are in place for nonprofits. Must have trustees and statutory agent with address. Operates as a corporation (with articles of incorporates). “Should” be insulated from liability (but not definite).

OH Drivers License Plate: Per Ernie Naples, we currently have 482 signatures (432 are “valid” signatures). We need 1,000. There is no designated deadline for obtaining additional signatures for this.

Scholarship Committee: Joe Hoyt has reapplied for the scholarship. Marty Bailey worked with Joe on the Windiate project, and highly recommends that Joe receive this. Joe is now instructing at East Carolina University, is a senior now, and is intending to continue to grad school. Roger Roth proposed motion to accept the current applicant (Joe Hoyt) and give \$1000 scholarship. 1st Marty Bailey, 2nd Linda Pansing.

There is currently \$1640 in the scholarship fund. Last year \$1000 was given (we had \$2200 at that time). Discussions followed as to whether we give an annual flat rate, half the fund, or a percentage of the fund, and how to address continued funding for scholarships. Council had hoped the license plates would continue to fund. currently, ScubaFest is the only source. Roger Roth offered to commit a portion of the underwater photo contest funds to the scholarship fund. A question was raised as to members that volunteered for the scholarship committee previously, but were never contacted to assist.

Dick Colwell proposed a motion to form a committee for ongoing application issues to meet prior to ScubaFest 2004. 1st Rich Lauer 2nd Marty Bailey. A new committee formed with Dick Colwell as chair and a signup sheet for volunteers in attendance (Note: I believe Dick has this committee list.) The purpose of the committee is to report back to Council with the following recommendations:
1) designate how much to expend; 2) where funds will come from; and 3) what to do with multiple applications.

Dive Ohio Video: Andy Dennis can loan his existing video, but is currently unavailable to work on. Joyce Hayward mentioned that there used to be a Dive Ohio slideshow. It was agreed that a PowerPoint version may be easier to produce than video. We could still incorporate video snippets and stills and make available on CDs. Joyce thought Rod Maxson might be able to work on this (Rod was not present). Marty Bailey said he could check with Rod.

One room to be used for travel shows; One room for exhibitors. Marty Bailey suggested having a speaker from each dive club present details about their club and recent/upcoming dive trips to share what is going on with Ohio divers. As far as equipment for presenters: Rich Lauer may be able to get LCD for highest quality video presentations; Joyce Hayward has two slide projectors, and Marty Bailey has two slide projectors. Carol Kender may be able to accommodate PowerPoint slide shows with one computer (Carol was not present to confirm).

Rich Lauer mentioned there are two schools of thought as to whether Council should hold ScubaFest at the same location each year. Last year 350 people attended. Maximum that may attend for this location is 275-300 (for dinner). Final decision on location is still to be determined.

Linda Hudson asked whether we can continue to add speakers. The answer was “Yes,” although some of the specific speakers mentioned may be best used as keynote speakers for upcoming ScubaFests.

Discussion about program ads asked whether to accept business card size and at what cost. Current advertisements for programs cost: Full page, \$100; ½ page \$60. Business card ads could be \$ 25 with all business cards accepted (dive clubs, dive shops, etc.)

There is currently no room available for dive clubs and dive shops. We may have a long table in the hall with all the dive club info at no charge to member clubs.

NEW BUSINESS

MAST: MAST (Maritime Archaeological Survey Team) is also researching nonprofit status for the purpose of buoying shipwrecks. Attendees asked to consider assisting MAST/LESRC with volunteer projects.

U/W Photo Contest: Roger Roth mentioned that any and all help with this international competition is appreciated. Specifically marketing agents (inviting sponsors and notifying of promotions we'll do for them).

BAD Banquet: Joyce Hayward thanked Patrick Heschel and Rich Lauer for their assistance in pushing for responses for ticket commitments. The 2003 Shipwrecks & Scuba banquet was nearly cancelled as only 42 tickets were committed a month prior to the event! Joyce wanted to make the Council's ScubaFest committee aware of their struggle to get responses for the banquet this year. She also asks that people forward their suggestions for the three-hour in-depth seminars for upcoming banquets.

OCSSDI Committee Reports - Oxygen, Kelleys Island

2003 was a year of legal dialogue, meetings, and negotiations, some of which went well for OCSSDI and the scuba community, some did not. A lot of your fellow divers have spent a good deal of time working for your interests. You've already read on page 3 about the SLAC committee. Here are a couple others:

The best news of the year has to do with the **oxygen legislation**. As you've been informed, it is technically illegal in Ohio to possess or administer oxygen to a person, unless you have a prescription. At the federal level an exception is made for emergency use; in Ohio there has been no such exception. Since we know that oxygen is a miracle drug when it comes to scuba accidents, OCSSDI has been working with State Rep. Keith Faber to have a law passed allowing certified divers to possess and use oxygen for diving emergencies.

In June, H.B. 64 passed the House 98-0, and in October it was introduced in the Senate. We were expecting to see it come out of committee sometime in 2004. However, it went rapidly through the committee hearings, was approved, and passed out of committee in December. Only a fluke kept it from going before the Senate that day.

So early this year, H.B. 64 should come up on the senate floor, be passed, and move on for Governor Taft's Signature. Ohio is one of the first states to go this far, and we should see a lot of others follow suit.

There is still work to be done, drafting guidelines for the state Pharmaceutical board. But we have a lot to be happy about, and a lot of people to thank, for this bill.

We're not so happy on the **Kelleys Island Preserve**. This was an attempt to designate an area around the island, site of several historic shipwrecks, as an underwater preserve, as has been done in other Great Lakes states.

Extensive research and efforts by a committee for the Kelleys Island Underwater Preserve (a subcommittee of SLAC), were met head on by the concerns of Kelleys Island locals. The Island residents had several concerns, including whether there would be any limitations on current Lake Erie activities, or whether the Preserve would affect use of people's private property.

Although a series of question and answer meetings were held attempting to address these concerns, many remained opposed to the Preserve. The SLAC committee eventually re-examined the shipwrecks intended for the Preserve and considered a non-contiguous Preserve approach. This would allow more intact shipwrecks to be included and move the focus away from the shores of Kelleys Island.

Between Preserve opposition and the afore-mentioned disbanding of SLAC, there are no further plans to pursue the Kelleys Island Preserve at this time.

We are made up of 21 member clubs. We are as varied as you can imagine: Some clubs have been around more than 40 years; some just a couple. This one requires OCSSDI membership; that one has just a couple representatives. Some clubs are affiliated with scuba shops, other independent; some are active in Council, some we hear from only at membership renewal time. Sizes from 12 to 100!

A reminder that each club has a \$50 credit from OCSSDI, to bring in a speaker or presenter to your meeting. We don't want you to pay one of your own members for giving a show, but feel free to request an honorarium to bring in an outside speaker.

OCSSDI's contact with you is done through your club representative, listed on page 2. I've noticed that this often changes year after year, but many of the OCSSDI reps have been the same for more than 8 years. Remember, we contact your rep each quarter to get info for our club news page; we also send them the annual renewal notices (Club renewals went out last month -- you should have gotten yours already).

You and your group are welcome to be as active as you want to be. Make sure you're getting all the info from us. Also remember, if your club can't come up with activities on your own, there is a lot going on elsewhere. Check out the calendar on page 10.
