Deadline Extended For OCSSDI Scholarship

Deadline to apply for the 2006 Ohio Council Memorial Scholarship has been extended until February 1, says Dick Colwell, Scholarship Fund Chairman (and OCSSDI Trustee).

The OCSSDI sponsors an educational scholarship for students to pursue careers related to marine biology, underwater archaeology, and other related fields. The Ohio Council Memorial Scholarship Fund is presented to honor the many who have contributed so much to scuba diving in Ohio. The OCSSDI raises scholarship money through raffles at the annual spring ScubaFest and Banquet Ball, donations from the state association, and support provided by Underwater Images photo/ video competition.

There are very few hard and fast rules. Generally we try to get applications in by the November OCSSDI meeting (November 13 this year); but it was decided to extend the application to see if more candidates might come forward.

The amount given to the Scholarship winner is decided on by the committee; also, if no qualified applicant comes forward, we hold the scholarship for that year. For the past two years, the scholarship amounted to \$1000 per annum.

To qualify, the applicant, or an immediate family member, must be a member in good standing of the OCSSDI, and pursuing a career in one of the fields mentioned above.

Interested individuals may download the scholarship requirements and application from the Ohio Council of Skin and Scuba Divers, web site. Click on the Scholarships tab along the left border. The application, and all supporting documents, should be mailed to OCSSDI Scholarship, PO Box 85, Summit Station, Ohio 43073.

The Council is very interested in spreading knowledge and education in our sport, shipwrecks, and the aquatic environment. This scholarship is one of the ways we work to do that. For a list of some of the recent recipients, click on Past Scholarship Recipients, on the scholarship web page.

ScubaFest 2006 is March 10-12, 2006

The countdown has begun to ScubaFest 2006, being held at the Clarion Dublin Hotel March 10-12, 2006.

This is the 47th year for the event, sponsored by the Ohio Council of Skin and Scuba Divers, Inc, your state scuba alliance. It is a weekend of FREE scuba exhibits, seminars, pool activities, film festivals, speakers, door prizes, workshops, and dancing, topped off by the Saturday night banquet dinner.

Keynote speaker for Saturday evening is Kathy Church, recognized as one of the world's foremost teachers and authors on underwater photography. She was a photo editor for Skin Diver magazine for 15 years and her work has appeared in dozens of books and magazines, including five of her own popular books on photo techniques. She was inducted into the Woman Diver Hall of Fame in March 2000, and her coffee table book "My Underwater Photo Journey" was published in 2004.

Seminars, speakers and presentations go on in three rooms Saturday and Sunday. One room is dedicated entirely to shipwrecks and technical subjects, a second room is all travel information. The third room covers general scuba general interest room -- medical aspects, diving for youth, and more.

As in past years, attendees will have a chance to walk away with door prizes, and to participate in silent auctions and raffles. Top prize so far is an 8-day, 7-night trip on board the Utila Aggressor!

Workshops

Popular and successful when introduced in 2005, the half-day and full-day workshops will return. The number and topics has been expanded. The list and prices are found on the registration form next page. Interesting, the workshops begin on Friday, allowing you to make a full and fun weekend out of it.

Notice the MAST workshop Friday afternoon: What is MAST, and Why is Nautical Archaeology Important? This is an introduction to trilateration - the basics of what and how to measure under water. There will be dry "shipwreck" practice, work with a baseline, and a number of "artifacts". The last half-hour will consist of actually putting measurements onto a site map.

Friday night is highlighted by the UnderWater Images film Festival, showcasing the best of the Underwater Images Video Competition. (See related article).

Ever trying for social activities, ScubaFest 2006 is adding a couple evening events: Friday night is Casino Party night, with proceeds going to MAST. Saturday evening brings back the dance party, with a live band beginning after the keynote banquet and going until 1:30 a.m. You can just join the group talking and socializing at the bar, and throughout the hotel.

Vendor exhibits are FREE all weekend. Participation in the silent auctions and raffle are FREE. Discover Diving and all pool activities are FREE. A weekend for the new diver, the experienced veteran, or the person just wondering.

Take advantage of a free underwater archaeology lecture at the Cleveland Museum of Natural History, sponsored by the Cleveland Archaeological Society.

The Pepper Wreck: Excavating and Reconstructing an Early 17th-Century Portuguese Indiaman will be presented Wednesday, November 9, at 7:30 pm. The speaker is Dr. Filipe Castro, of the Texas A&M University.

The wreck was found in 1993 off the mouth of the Tagus River near Lisbon. The shipwreck was tentatively identified as the Portuguese Indiaman *Nossa Senhora dos Martires*, which had been lost at this location on its return voyage from Cochin, India, on September 14, 1606.

Dr. Filipe Castro explains how archaeological excavation disclosed an interesting collection of artifacts from the late 16th and early 17th centuries and allowed for the study of the hull structure.

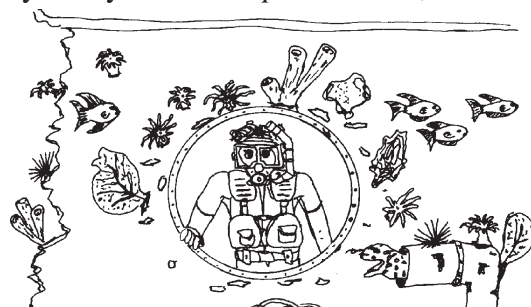

a whale's gonna do what he's gotta do....

NIAGARA FALLS, Ontario (AP) - An enterprising young killer whale at Marineland has figured out how to use fish as bait to catch seagulls - and shared his strategy with his fellow whales.

Michael Noonan, a professor of animal behavior at Canisius College in Buffalo, N.Y., made the discovery by accident while studying orca acoustics. "One day I noticed one of the young whales appeared to have come up with a procedure for luring gulls down to the pool," the professor said. "I found it interesting so I noted it in my log."

First, the young whale spit regurgitated fish onto the surface of the water, then sank below the water and waited. If a hungry gull landed on the water, the whale would surge up to the surface, sometimes catching a free meal of his own.

Noonan watched as the same whale set the same trap again and again.

Within a few months, the whale's younger half brother adopted the practice. Eventually the behavior spread and now five Marineland whales supplement their diet with fresh fowl, the scientist said.

"It looked like one was watching while the other tried," Noonan said of the whale's initial behavior.

The capacity to come up with the gull-baiting strategy and then share the technique with others - known as cultural learning in the scientific world - was once believed to be one of those abilities that separated humans from other animals.

But biologists have since proven certain animals, including dolphins and chimps, do this.

"This is an example in which a new behavior spread through a population," Noonan said. "We had the opportunity to see a tradition form and spread in exactly the way that cultures do in humans."
